
MENOPAUSE PATHOCHART

PATHOPHYSIOLOGY

Menopause is a normal, expected, and irreversible condition associated with aging in women, caused by a natural decline in reproductive hormones that marks the end of a woman's reproductive period.

ASSESSMENT FINDINGS

- Hot flashes (most common)
- Insomnia
- Weight gain, bloating
- Mood changes, depression
- Breast pain, headaches
- Osteoporosis
